Spring Treat Cards - Cricut Instructions

Materials

- Cricut cutting machine
- Cricut Design Space (DS software) on ipad or computer
- Print then cut .svg file(s) uploaded into DS (<u>Bunny Bait</u>, <u>Leprechaun Bait</u>, <u>Birthday Balm</u>)
- Cutting Mat
- Cardstock
- Glue sticks
- Wireless color printer
- Plastic Lip Balm/Money Holder (https://a.co/d/ONDuwKF) for birthday card
- Small glass jars (https://a.co/d/3ILAyE2) for "bait "cards
- Funnel for filling glass jars (optional)
- Oats with colored sprinkles/bird seed (optional)
- Tubes of lip balm (optional)


iPad Setup

- Note: each cutting machine can only be connected via Bluetooth to one device (iPad) at a time.
 - Go to Settings on the iPad and confirm Bluetooth is off until you're ready to print and cut your design to avoid conflicts.

Preparing and Printing the Image

- Open the Cricut Design Space app on your iPad.
- Click on the green + circle to begin a new project.

• From the menu bar at the bottom click **Upload** the **Open Uploaded Images.**

 Choose your design, click Add to Canvas. View. If your design needs backing (Bunny or Leprechaun Bait), add to canvas as well.



 For this example, we will be working on the Bunny Bait card, but the process will be the same for all "bait" cards. The Plastic Lip Balm/Money Holder requires no second piece for backing.

Sizing


- For "Bait" cards with glass jars, resize the cards to 4" x 5".
 - Click on Layers, highlight the layers for the front and back cards.
 - Click Edit, then Align and Center this will stack the two layers on top of each other.
 - Click Group to treat both layers as one.
 - Change the Width to 4" (the height should automatically adjust to 5").
- Change the back to Cut only (not Print and Cut).
 - Highlight Bunny-Bait-Card-Backing layer in the Layers panel.
 - Under Operation, click on Basic Cut. Color doesn't matter because it will be the color of the cardstock of your choice.





Make It

At this point, you can connect the iPad to the
Cricut. Swipe down from the upper-right corner of the iPad screen and turn on
Bluetooth. Swipe up to return to DS. Click the green < button, then menu bar, and
machine selection.










Click Canvas when all steps are completed.



- Click **Make It,** you will see "Mat 1 of 2" and "Print, Basic Cut" at the top.
- Click Next.
- Choose the wireless, color printer and load 65 lb white cardstock in it.
- Set Material, find "Cardstock intricate cut".
- Once the design has printed on the cardstock, stick it to the Cricut cutting mat and load it into the Cricut.
- Click the blinking light on the Cricut.
- The Cricut will read the registration marks on the cardstock and then cut the design.

Bait

- Unload the mat.
- Place another piece of cardstock, in a color coordinated with the printed card, on the mat and load into the Cricut to cut the backing.

 NOTE: when removing cardstock from the mat, do not life the cardstock up off the mat as this will cause it to curl. Instead, turn the mat upside/sticky side down and roll the mat back and away from the cardstock.

Assembly

- "Bait" Cards
 - Glue along the edge of the back of the front/printed card, being careful not to glue inside of cutout areas, where the small jar will be inserted. You want the cut flaps to remain free to lift up.
 - o Align the corners with the backing and press the front and back together.
 - Lift the flaps.
 - Fill the jars with oats and sprinkles (you can use glitter here, but no one likes cleaning that up so use with caution ⑤).
 - Slide the jars into the flaps.
- Lip Balm/Money Holder Cards
 - Attach adhesive strips to edges of plastic holder.
 - o Remove remaining backing from adhesive strips.
 - o Insert lip balm or money into plastic holder.
 - Attach plastic holder, with money or lip balm inside, to the card in the area indicated.
